PRELIMINARY PROGRAM: THE 72TH ANNUAL PACIFIC SOCIOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION MEETING MARCH 29-APRIL 1, 2001 CATHEDRAL HILL HOTEL, SAN FRANCISCO THEME: TRANSFORMATIONS: SOCIAL ACTIVISM AND SOCIAL CHANGE

The preliminary program for the 2001 PSA meeting is now complete. Make your plans now to attend PSA's 72nd Annual Meeting scheduled on March 29-April 1 at the Cathedral Hill Hotel in San Francisco. Nearly 200 sessions are planned, along with many roundtables.

Sessions will begin on Thursday, March 29th, at 12:00 noon and continue through Sunday, April 1 until 1:30 PM. **Please note that each session will run 90 minutes.**

Registration will open at 10:00 am on Thursday the 29th.

President Scott Coltrane, UC Riverside, has organized several Presidential Sessions, including a series of sessions and roundtables on Reviewing Human Subjects Research and Author Meets Critics Sessions.

Author Meets Critics Presidential Sessions scheduled are *Grassroots Warriors: Activist Mothering, Community Work, and The War on Poverty* with author Nancy Naples from UC Irvine; *Behind the Label: Inequality in the Los Angeles Apparel Industry* with authors Edna Bonacich, UC Riverside, and Richard P. Appelbaum, UC Santa Barbara; and *A Generation Divided: The New Left, The New Right, and the 1960s* with author Rebecca Klatch, UC San Diego.

Reviewing Human Subjects Research sessions organized by Paul T. Melevin of the California Department of Rehabilitation are "Applied Sociology in Action," "Reviewing Human Subjects Research: Questions from Applied Sociologists in the Private Sector" and "Reviewing Human Subjects Research: Questions from Applied Sociologists Working for Government Agencies;" with roundtables on "Reviewing Human Subjects Research: Questions from Academics" and "Reviewing Human Subjects Research: Questions from Students"

There will also be publishers' exhibits, a welcome and new members reception, a presidential reception, and the usual student reception where books donated from the publishers will be raffled off along with several \$50 checks from the PSA. Sharon Araji, University of Alaska-Anchorage is organizing a walking tour of San Francisco too (for more details see p. 7 of this newsletter).

Please join Program Chair, Bill McCarthy, UC Davis, and your friends and colleagues in San Francisco for what promises to be an engaging, informative and lively annual meeting. We look forward to seeing you! Come and have a good time networking with sociological colleagues, listening and talking about sociological ideas, and enjoying the beautiful city of San Francisco.

IMPORTANT NOTICE – REGISTRATION AND MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR THOSE LISTED IN THE PRELIMINARY PROGRAM

Payment of Registration Fees and Membership Dues

Several points about meeting preregistration, program participation, and membership are discussed below. These items need your attention.

1. Preregistration and Membership Dues

All program participants must preregister for the Annual Meeting before March 15, 2001 in order to have their names listed in the final program. A form is included in this newsletter. If you have not already paid preregistration fees, please return the form with your payment. If you were a member in 1999 or 2000, you should already have received a renewal for 2001 dues and a preregistration form for the Annual Meeting.

There are four clarifications to the preregistration fee and membership dues requirements for those who are listed on the program in Portland:

In cases of multiple-authored papers, co-authors who are NOT attending the meeting do not have to pay preregistration fees or membership dues. However, the person responsible for presenting the paper in April, must preregister and must also pay membership dues. In other words, at least one co-author must preregister and pay membership dues or the entire paper and all co-authors will be dropped from the program.

If you are a sociologist from the western region, you must pay both 2001 membership dues and 2001 preregistration fees.

If you are a sociologist but NOT from the western region, you MUST pay preregistration fees, but you do not have to pay 2001 membership dues.

If you are NOT a sociologist, you must pay 2001 preregistration fees, but you do NOT have to pay 2001 membership dues.

2. Program Participation

Being on the program means being listed in any position – presider, moderator, panelist, critic, roundtable presenter, roundtable presider/discussant, seminar leader/presenter, discussant, session organizer, presenter, workshop leader, speaker, etc. In short, any place your name appears is counted as a participation.

3. Attendance at the Meeting

If you are attending the meeting but are not on the program, you are expected to pay either preregistration fees or registration fees at the door. Preregistration fees are \$25 for faculty and/or over \$15,000 income per year and \$17.50 for students and/or under \$15,000 income per year. Registration fees at the door will be \$35 for faculty and/or over \$15,000 income per year and \$25 for students and/or under \$15,000 annual income.

Hotel Information for the 2001 PSA Annual Meeting, San Francisco, California, March 29-April 1

The 2001 PSA Annual Meeting will take place at the Cathedral Hill Hotel, 1101 Van Ness Ave at Geary, San Francisco, CA 94125-6986.

The hotel has 400 rooms and is located near the Civic Center. Union Square is seven blocks away, Polk Street in one block away, a cable car stop is about four blocks north, and there are many interesting and reasonable ethnic restaurants within walking distance of the Hotel. A BART station is available at the Civic Center, about six blocks south of the Hotel.

The PSA Convention Rate for 2001 is \$115 single and \$125 double, plus 14% city tax. To make a reservation call 1-800-622-0855 or the hotel directly at 415-776-8200. Please ask for the PSA convention rate. **ALL RESERVATIONS MUST BE MADE BY FEBRUARY 26, 2001** to guarantee the PSA rate. The PSA room block may be sold out before the 26th so make your reservations early. If the PSA room block has sold out or you make your reservations after the 26th, the hotel may still have rooms, but the prevailing room rate will be charged, not the PSA rate.

Hotel Parking for registered guests will be at the prevailing rate for a 24 hour period, with in and out privileges. Other persons attending the conference but not staying overnight at the hotel, must pay the regular rate for non guest parking.

The Cathedral Hill Hotel is about 20 minutes from the San Francisco Airport. A variety of shuttles will take you from the San Francisco airport to the Cathedral Hill Hotel. They continuously circulate around the airport.

SUGGESTIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

[Note: This is reprinted from the Newsletter of the Midwest Sociological Association and was written by the Editor, Barbara Keating, Mankato State University. It has been slightly edited for the PSA. We continue to reprint this piece because it offers excellent advice for everyone on the program.]

If you were a discussant, how would you like to get the papers for review the night before the session? As an audience member, how do you like it when presenters read their papers word for word while droning on and on through fifty years of literature review?

I make the following suggestions to new and experienced presenters.

1. Get your completed paper to the discussant at least a month before the meetings. A good review can be tremendously helpful for revising the paper for publication. But it takes time and thought. Every year, however, some discussants do not get papers until they arrive at the meetings. The discussants are doing you a favor. Help them to help you by giving them the time they need.
2. After you have finished the formal written version of your paper, edit it for a presentation version,. Remember, you will normally have only 12-15 minutes to give your paper if there are four other presenters. Discuss only what is important. For a traditional research paper, for example, focus on the findings. Introduce the topic succinctly, summarize the literature briefly, mention the methods in passing and spend most of your time discussing the findings and their implications.
3. Do not read your paper to the audience. Talk about it. The well-crafted written formal sentence may be a better visual than audio experience. Remember, you audience is listening, not reading.
4. Arrive at your session ten minutes early. The presider will brief you on organization, order, and time limits.
5. Adhere to time limits. Four to five paper presentations, discussant comments, and audience participation do not allow much flexibility in one session. Presiders may enforce appropriate social sanctions on presenters who monopolize time.
6. If you bring copies of your paper for distribution, you may reduce the weight by printing single space on both sides of each page. Many presenters must bring copies of the statistical tables or model figures, perhaps with a abstract.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR PSA AWARDS FOR 2001

If you wish to submit a nomination for an award, you must supply the supporting materials and documentation detailed below for each award. While it is possible for a person, publication, etc., to be nominated in more than one year, if appropriate, no nominations or supporting materials will be carried over from year to year. It is the nominator's responsibility to submit three copies of all nominations and supporting materials including articles, books, etc. by the nomination deadline. **The deadline will be February 1, 2001 for all awards except in the case of the Distinguished Scholarship Award. The nomination deadline for that award will be November 1, 2001.**

The 2001 Distinguished Scholarship Award

The Pacific Sociological Association's Award for Distinguished Scholarship is granted to sociologists from the Pacific region in recognition of major intellectual contributions embodied in a recently published book or series of at least three articles on a common theme. To be eligible for the 2001 award, a book must have been published in 1999 or later. If a nomination is based on a series of articles, the most recent article in that series must have been published in 1999 or later. The Committee does NOT accept nominations for the Scholarship Award from Publishers. Nominators must be from individual members of the PSA. If a book has both a hardback and paperback copyright date and no significant changes have been made in the book between editions, the committee will consider the earlier copyright date as the one determining eligibility for the award. Nominations for distinguished scholarship and all supporting materials must be submitted by November 1, 2000. You must provide the Committee with three copies of the book and/or articles.

The 2001 Distinguished Contributions to Teaching Award

Individual Teaching Award: The Pacific Sociological Association honors outstanding career contributions to teaching, a series of projects, or a specific product or process which an individual or small group of individuals in the western region have contributed to the teaching and learning of sociology. These may include

- Products and/or processes that enhance undergraduate and/or graduate intellectual inquiry and learning of sociology within one's own institution or beyond its campus. Examples include innovative teaching techniques, use of new technologies, service learning, distance learning, learning assessment of sociology, textbooks, publications related to teaching, teaching programs, devices or materials, laboratory designs, instructional computer packages, innovative curricular contributions or curriculum design, or workshops;
- Relevant contributions to state, regional, or national associations;
- Activities that illuminate, educate, and nurture public understanding and appreciation of the usefulness of the discipline and of sociological principles and research. The Pacific Sociological Association's Distinguished Contributions to Teaching Award is given to an individual sociologist from the western region and/or to a department of sociology in the western region. The award is given to those who have developed teaching programs, curricula, or materials which have been unusually effective in enhancing student understanding and fostering appreciation of sociology as a field of study. The grounds for nominations are open but include textbooks and other teaching materials, laboratory designs, instructional computer packages, innovative curricular contributions, and evidence of special impact on students. You must provide the Committee with three copies of the supporting documentation.

For the individual teaching award, nominations should include:

1. The name of the nominee, a very detailed statement with a very specific explanation of how this individual's work constitutes a [career] contribution to the teaching of sociology
2. Letters of support from individuals having direct knowledge of the nominee's contributions.
3. Copies of any teaching materials developed by the nominee (if relevant to the nomination).
4. Some evidence of the nominee's impact in the classroom (these might be student evaluations or other evidence).
5. The nominee's vita.
6. Additional supporting materials are encouraged.

Department Contributions To Teaching Award: The Pacific Sociological Association honors a Department of Sociology, school, or other collective actor in the western region for its outstanding contribution to the teaching of sociology. Individual strengths and competencies combine, in consensus, to produce a single product or process or a series of projects that

- Improve(s) the quality of undergraduate and/or graduate teaching and learning, e.g., sequential curriculum design; teaching programs, devices, or materials; service learning; distance learning; or learning assessment of sociology, etc.;
 - Relevant contributions to state, regional, or national associations;
 - Activities that illuminate, educate and nurture public understanding and appreciation of the usefulness of the discipline and of sociological principles and research.
- For the departmental teaching award, nominations should include evidence that supports the departmental nominee in the above categories. You must provide three copies of the evidence.

The 2001 Distinguished Practice Award

The Pacific Sociological Association's Distinguished Practice Award honors sociological work in the Pacific region (whether by an academic or non-academic) which has an impact on government, business, health, or other settings not directly connected with academia. The grounds for nomination include (but are not limited to) any applied sociological activity that improves organizational performance, contributes to community betterment, and/or eases human suffering. You must provide the Committee with three copies of the supporting documentation:

1. A nominating letter which provides an overview of the nominee's distinguished practice contributions;
2. Letters of support from individuals having direct knowledge of the nominee's distinguished contribution to sociological practice.
3. Copies of presentations at scholarly conferences, published articles, and/or grant/contract proposals, primarily authored by the nominee, which address issues in sociological practice. This award is given bi-annually.

The 2001 Distinguished Undergraduate Student Paper Award and \$200 honorarium

The Pacific Sociological Association's Distinguished Student Paper Award recognizes an undergraduate student for a paper of high professional quality. This award includes a \$200 honorarium. To be eligible a paper must be (a) worthy of special recognition for outstanding scholarship; and (b) written by an undergraduate student or students in the Pacific region. The paper must be unpublished. You must provide the Committee with three copies of the paper, including an abstract, accompanied by at least one letter of support.

The 2001 Distinguished Graduate Student Paper Award and \$200 honorarium

The Pacific Sociological Association's Distinguished Student Paper Award recognizes a graduate student for a paper of high professional quality. This award includes a \$200 honorarium. To be eligible a paper must be (a) worthy of special recognition for outstanding scholarship; (b) in a format appropriate for submission to a major journal with a likelihood of acceptance; and (c) written by a graduate student or students attending a University in the Pacific region. At least one letter of support and three copies of the paper, including an abstract, should accompany nominations.

The 2001 Distinguished Contribution to Sociological Perspectives Award

The Pacific Sociological Association's Distinguished Contribution to *Sociological Perspectives* Award honors an outstanding article published in *Sociological Perspectives* during a two-year period. To be eligible, the article must be worthy of special recognition for outstanding scholarship and contribution to the discipline. The article must have been published in Vol. 41 (1998) or Vol. 42 (1999). This award is given bi-annually. You must provide the Committee with three copies of the nominated article.

THE NOMINATIONS PROCESS FOR THE ABOVE AWARDS.

Any PSA member can place a nomination by writing directly to the Chair of the PSA Awards Committee. In order to be considered you must provide the required documentation as presented above for each particular award for which there is a nomination. **The deadline is February 1, 2001 for all awards except in the case of the Distinguished Scholarship Award. INITIAL CALL FOR SESSIONS 73rd Annual Meeting, April 18-21, 2002 Vancouver, British Columbia

SOCIAL JUSTICE

One of the most fundamental sociological goals is the promotion of social justice. While most would agree on the primacy of this goal, what social justice means and what actions may promote social justice are complex, varied, and often the subject of heated debate and controversy. What is social justice? For whom? Who decides? How are conflicting claims adjudicated when different groups, communities, or nations are directly at odds in their justice claims? Since the founding of the discipline, sociologists working both within and outside the academy have sought to define justice and to understand those social, economic, historical, and psychological processes that can generate injustice and those that can actively work toward social justice.

The 2002 PSA Program will focus on sociology's contributions to understanding and to promoting social justice. How have concerns about social justice been woven into the history of the sociological discipline? How have attempts to understand justice and to ameliorate social injustices led sociologists to work across disciplines in interdisciplinary and cross-disciplinary programs? How have sociologists intersected with those working in the public sector to promote social justice? How have and how should sociological research, teaching, and service contribute to social justice in the world at large? Should we work toward an expanded or different voice in sociopolitical debates than has been true in the past? The 2002 Program Committee hopes and intends to see these questions addressed at a broad array of levels of analysis and through a broad array of empirical and conceptual methodologies. We look for sessions that address social justice from a structural and institutional level, as well as from a meso, small group and organizational level. We also look for sessions that address social justice experientially, on the ground, as injustice is resisted and as justice is achieved. We hope to see sessions that address justice and injustice from both dominant and subordinate positions, as well as sessions that address the experiences of social justice in both ostensibly private and public spheres, analyzing their inextricable connections and interdependencies. More generally, we hope to see sessions that complicate the sometimes overly facile dichotomies of analytic frameworks about justice.

The 2002 PSA Program Committee seeks to generate a broad array of sessions not only in terms of these varying themes of justice and injustice, but also in the sites of application and analysis, and in the session formats. We hope, for example, to see sessions that address regional perspectives on social justice; these are the first PSA meetings in many years to take place in Canada, and we intend to incorporate this regional theme into the substance of the meetings. We anticipate sessions on themes such as environmental struggles in Clayoquot Sound on Vancouver Island, sessions on native initiatives such as the creation of the territory of Nunavut, sessions on the enduring

struggles over identity and sovereignty in Quebec. We also look for sessions on issues particular to our regional association with the Pacific Rim, from questions of Pan-Asian and Pan-Pacific economic, political, and social justice, to sessions that address population flows across North America, questions of immigration, citizenship, borders and border crossing, the mobility of capital and labor. We also look for sessions that address ways in which new and emerging technologies complicate regional identities and allegiances, and how these technologies can be harnessed – and ways in which they can be co-opted – by efforts both to achieve and to block social justice.

We invite sociological researchers, educators, and practitioners from all perspectives to join in our analyses of social justice and injustice at the 73rd annual meeting of the Pacific Sociological Association. The 2002 PSA meeting in Vancouver promises exciting and vibrant exchanges of ideas in a broad spectrum of interactive formats: roundtables, debates, panel discussions, paper presentations, multimedia sessions and workshops. Come share your ideas and innovations in sociological theory, methods, teaching, and practice. As always, papers and presentations that are not directly related to the meeting theme are also encouraged, and will make up a large part of the program.

PIONEERING POLICIES ON INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, DISTANCE LEARNING AVAILABLE

San Diego State University has taken the lead in formulating policies on several key university issues that significantly affect faculty interests. On the Web Page for San Diego State University, the category for SDSU's Senate (see Hot Topics, and University Educational Policies) contains policy statements on Intellectual Property (IP), Year-Round Operations (YRO), and Distance Learning (DL), the latter of which has already been discussed in The Chronicle of Higher Education as highly detailed, useful, and innovative.

These were all passed by SDSU's Senate and approved by SDSU President Stephen L. Weber. The same positive evaluation could be given for the other two policies of Intellectual Property — and especially its clause 3.322 which addresses the crucial issue of “works made for hire” — and Year-Round Operations that addresses several faculty interests. All three of these policies — DL, YRO, and IP — could be used by other colleges and universities to form their own similar policies since all of SDSU's policies were fully negotiated between faculty and administration. In addition, and due to the same reasons, they could also be used as the basis for legislation at both the state and national levels. The Faculty Coalition for Public Higher Education (FCPHE) is working to advance these policies because they address issues of concern to the faculty that have often been left undefined and unstated. Given their importance, clarification of these issues is essential, and the policies go a long way towards such a reasonable clarification.
